#### LAMKA COLLEGE

#### **Introduction:**

LAMKA (which means "Crossroad", the local name of Churachandpur town) COLLEGE was founded on the 7<sup>th</sup> June, 1976. It is one among the only two highest institutions for higher education in the district. The College is a co-educational institution, catering to the needs of the tribal and other backward students in this part of the country. The College was taken over by the Government of Manipur in the year 1979. The College is located at New Lamka, Churachandpur, Manipur.

The College was first affiliated to the University of Gauhati and later affiliated to the University of Manipur when the State Government established the University in the year 1981.

The College offers a sound liberal and general education aiming at the development of character and better personality of each student through a wide range of curricular and co-curricular programmes. The College is a multi-faculty institution providing education in Humanities, Social Science and Commerce.

The medium of instruction, except vernacular subjects, is English. The Modern Indian Languages taught are Manipuri, Mizo, Hmar, Paite and Thadou-Kuki.

The College is affiliated to the University Grants Commission under Section 2(f) and 1 (b) of UGC Act, 1956.
